### **Treasurer's Report**

September 2024 Financials Submitted by Ken Bartlett

Our regular offering through September was approximately 62.4% of its nine-month budget amount (**\$79,504.80** of **\$127,497.00**; **\$47,992.20** in arrears). A \$30,300 bequest was received in May. Total receipts through September were **\$130,978.46** of the nine-month budget amount of **\$146,997.00**, **\$16,018.54** less than budget.

Insurance and real estate taxes have been fully paid for the year, per capita has been paid for three-quarters of the year. Total expenses through September were \$129,062.61 against the nine-month budget of \$146,997.00, resulting in outflows less than budget by \$17,934.39.

September net was approximately **\$2,155** in the red. September year-to-date net was **\$1,915.85** in the black.

Receipts through September were \$44,425.21 more than a year ago, while expenses were \$63,372.44 more than a year ago. This results in the net being \$18,947.23 worse than a year ago.

Investment returns were up **12.3%** year-to-date. The \$30,000 bequest received in May was invested and investments totaled **\$310,039.70** as of the end of September. Total funds available were **\$338,350.67** as of the end of September. \$151,500.41 of this amount is general undesignated funds, \$156,686.74 is Condit's Building Fund balance, and \$30,163.52 is the aggregate balance of a variety of special funds.

# Lessons from the Genealogy of Jesus *by Jennie Kavage*

"So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them." Genesis 1:27

When Condit's Education Chair Melissa Vermillion couldn't find ready-made curriculum for this fall's Sunday School classes, she made it herself. Most of what was available, she recounts, was for larger and lengthier classes than Condit's. She didn't like the idea of spending money on material that wouldn't be able to be used.

Christmas will be the culmination of the season's work and as she thought about it Melissa was convinced the children needed a basic orientation to the Bible journey from Adam to the birth of Jesus. After consulting with Pastor Sam Monte and others who have worked in Condit's Education Christian program, she decided to create 13 lessons based on genealogy.

She drew on her ownChristianEducationgrowing up inMethodistandPresbyterianchurches

and on genealogy that's readily available in the Bible. Genesis 4-5 gives the line from Adam to Noah and Genesis 10-11 goes from Noah to Abram, who was renamed Abraham. The New Testament opens with the lineage from Abraham to Joseph.

The story of the first man and woman as presented in Genesis kicked off Condit's Sunday School classes in September. Melissa says the foundation for families is in this story.

Most of the people the classes are built around will be familiar to anyone who grew up going to Sunday School: Adam and Eve, Noah, Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Rebekah, Jacob and Leah, Ruth and Boaz, David and Bathsheba, and Solomon. Some like Judah and Tamar, Salmon and Rahab are more obscure. In some cases the story will center on the women. In others, the subject had a difficult, even unsavory, past but, as Melissa puts it, "God <u>chooses</u> that person to be in the lineage."

Sandy Thacker made the family tree that hangs on the north wall in the Fellowship Hall. On the right are maps that show the physical journey of the generations as they range throughout the Middle East from Egypt to Babylon. On the left are the words children will learn with each lesson. **Trinity**, **holy** and **fellowship** are the first on the list.

> Every other week the children receive a Bible verse to commit to memory. First was the verse that begins this article. Coming up with an activity to reinforce each lesson was the hard part, Melissa notes. Parents can see the lesson summary, the scripture it's from, new words learned and the memory verse on a handout each week.

Condit has a corps of teachers who take turns leading the classes: Teresa Gorsuch, Marianne Westbrook, Georgann Whitney, Beverly Saksa, Sandy Thacker, Pam Sheets

and Melissa. Odessa Monte has helped set up and clean up the room.

There will be a break from genealogy for Thanksgiving when the lesson will be built upon First Thessalonians 5:18 "In everything give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you." Discussion will center on the fact that each person has different circumstances and each child will make a thankful list.

Christmas emphasis will be on the Book of Luke and the familiar decree from Caesar Augustus calling all people to their home cities to be taxed. *"And Joseph Continued on page 6*

also went up . . . unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David) To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child."

The story of Jesus will continue in January with a book on his beginnings that will take Sunday School classes to Lent.

Special events also are planned for the Sunday School age group during the year, Melissa says, including the Easter Road Trip offered last spring, a Vacation Bible School Experience this past summer and the October Bonfire.
