Is it like some uncanny valley thing where they look human but off somehow? It's no wonder that when angels show up, they have to remind people to be not afraid.

Our devotional and study this Advent season is called, "Calling all Angels" and it is about fearlessness and strength. This advent season as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ, we need to do the hard work. What is it that makes us afraid? Why are we afraid when the world is in chaos? What can we do to remember that God is with us? What does "Be not afraid" look like for us today?

The last meeting for 2024 for FFW was held on Friday, November 8th at the Sunbury United Methodist Church. The quarterly luncheon was hosted by SUMC and Condit

provided the speaker for the meeting. SUMC provided a wonderful lunch of chicken salad croissants and broccoli cheese soup.

The speaker was Sheli Morcom with Glory Reins Stables. MaryAnn Counts heard her speak at another church and felt she would be great for our meeting. Sheli provided a wonderful faith story on why they wanted to do this, and how she and her husband, Bob got their program started. They have used horses for healing at their farm for the last six years. They connect hurting kids (aged 8 - 17 yrs) with rescued or retired horses and ponies. The stable is a non-profit mission supported by churches. The kids called "ranchers" are matched one on one with a mentor and a horse that they can relate to. They do barn chores, tack up their own horses and ride with a support person. There is no charge for the ranchers and they have helped hundreds of kids over the years. They have a website if anyone wants to get more information.

The business meeting followed with a discussion on selling gift cards this month. Order forms (one per church) and money needs to be turned in to Debbie Skeens by Dec 1. Cards will be ready after Dec 14. (Condit Women's Circle has opted not to participate this year)

What's all that moving like? Elijah says "I just go with the flow." As far as getting started in a new school, he says he's found it to be like this: "The first year you don't talk to anyone but the second year you start talking to people." He's making friends now, he says.



That's not all. Many Sundays Elijah is also the acolyte. At the proper time he quietly rises from his chair, goes into the narthex to ready the lighter and walks down the center aisle of the sanctuary to light the altar candles. Symbolically it is an important responsibility. The First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, Nebraska describes it this way:

The word acolyte is from an ancient Greek word that means attendant, or "follower." Light and fire remind us that God is here with us. When you bring the light (fire) into the sanctuary where people are gathering to worship, and when you light the candles, you are reminding the people that God is with us at home, at school, and at work as well as in the worship service. When you light the torch again, before extinguishing the candles, and then walk out with your torch lit, you remind the people that when we scatter out into the world, God will be there with us. Lit candles also remind us that Jesus Christ is the light of the world.

Treasurer's Report

October 2024 Financials Submitted by Ken Bartlett

Our regular offering through October was approximately 62.2% of its ten-month budget amount (**\$88,116.80** of **\$141,663.33**; **\$53,546.53** in arrears). A \$30,300 bequest was received in May. Total receipts through October were **\$141,594.02** of the ten-month budget amount of **\$163,330.00**, **\$21,735.98** less than budget.

Insurance and real estate taxes have been fully paid for the year, per capita has been paid for three-quarters of the year. Total expenses through October were \$145,022.71 against the ten-month budget of \$163,330.00, resulting in outflows less than budget by \$18,307.29.

October net was approximately \$5,345 in the red. October year-to-date net was \$3,428.69 in the red. Receipts through October were \$42,825.34 more than a year ago, while expenses were \$68,406.93 more than a year ago. This results in the net being \$25,581.59 worse than a year ago.

Investment returns were up **11.8%** year-to-date. The \$30,000 bequest received in May was invested and investments totaled **\$308,906.81** as of the end of October. Total funds available were **\$331,873.33** as of the end of October. \$146,018.32 of this amount is general undesignated funds, \$155,857.44 is Condit's Building Fund balance, and \$29,997.57 is the aggregate balance of a variety of special funds.
